<b>2</b>	<b>Aims of the module and acquired skills</b>				
	<p>Students get a direct access to the research of the Junior Research Groups at the Graduate School of the Faculty of Arts and Humanities “a.r.t.e.s.” and to the Research Lab, they thus receive a tool that enables them to conduct interdisciplinary research in a humanist tradition and to apply their skills in specific research process. The students will be capable to apply independently their detailed and critical subject's understanding to new and complex contexts beyond the borders of their own discipline and to discuss it in a multi-disciplinary research environment. Student learn to integrate their knowledge and competences into new contexts and to develop new interdisciplinary approaches which will raise their M.A. thesis (and possibly their PhD thesis) on a new level.</p>				
<b>3</b>	<b>Contents of the module</b>				
	<p>In the module “a.r.t.e.s.”, students get an insight into the topics and questions on which the teams of the two research groups “Transformations of Life” and “Transformations of Knowledge” are currently working in the a.r.t.e.s. Research Lab. The seminars are being held by the two junior professors of the a.r.t.e.s. research lab with a focus on “Transformations of Life” and „Transformations of Knowledge”. They teach general and specific methods of interdisciplinary research in the humanities and make the students familiar with the research of the two research groups. Students have the opportunity to discuss and further investigate into the topics and receive support for the planning to conduction of their own interdisciplinary projects.</p>
